- To manage the process for engaging applicants ensuring signed guidelines for engagement and staggered programme start dates. Working with the Communications and IT manager to schedule challenges.
- To pursue all potential interest in undertaking the programme, and actively support all leads to achieve our target numbers, to engage with as many young people as possible – though to completion of the 3 month programme.
- To positively engage with all DofE participants, replying to every Challenge Response received on a weekly basis with thoughtful, encouraging and inspiring feedback.
- To take on the role of 'Assessor' for these participants and prepare and upload their Assessor's Reports to the edofe page.
- To undertake the impact monitoring for this programme. Collating the feedback questionnaire, and parents feedback data.
- To liaise with the DofE Award organisation fulfilling their reporting requirements, and renewal of our Approved Activity Provider status.
- To design and run a Youth Advisory Panel built up from ex-DofE participants, as part of the wider YCW strategy.
- To provide reports to Trustee meetings and Impact data as requested.
- To support other members of the YCW team as requested.
